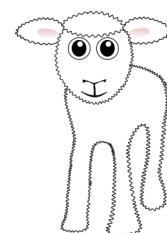

Police Vetting

Any adult accompanying a school group on an overnight trip must be police vetted - a process that involves the school receiving information about any recorded past convictions. This information is held in the strictest confidence.

We ask that people who would like to be available for overnight trips contact the school office to arrange for the process to get underway. One of the steps involves bringing **2 forms of identification** (including one with a photo) personally to school for verification.

Once vetted, the clearance stays current for three years, so the approved person will be able to accompany multiple trips over this time.

The school will cover the cost of this process.

The Great Potato Growing Competition

Tauraroa Area School is holding their first school wide potato growing competition. This competition gives the opportunity for our students to practise Honesty and Responsibility (two of our Cornerstone Values) while also promoting sustainability.

To enter, students need to bring \$2 to the office (year 7-13 and staff) or to class teacher (year 1-6) where they will be given a seeding potato and a plant bag to grow it in. There is no profit expected to be made from this competition. Should there be any profit, it will be used to help run this competition again in the future.

Students take their potato and bag home where they grow their potato, feeding it whatever they wish to.

Rules:

Only the seed potato given can be planted

The bag provided must be used

No replacement of potato allowed

Adding of potatoes to bag or cheating of any nature will result in disqualification

Students will be notified nearer the time (end of October/beginning of November) to bring their bag in minus the foliage which can just be cut off at the base.

Process for confiscation/removal of an item

Uniform:

- Waka teachers should address incorrect uniform items with students during waka time.
- Students can take incorrect item off and put in bag. If this happens regularly, waka teacher should confiscate.
- Students should be sent to the office to replace any non-uniform items that can not be taken off. If the item cannot be replaced a member of SMT or Dean will issue a uniform pass.
- Any student in incorrect uniform will have their item confiscated (by any teacher) if they do not have a uniform pass.
- non-uniform items will be returned at lunch time, a week to the day the item was confiscated.

Mobile phones, music devices and BYOD etc:

- These items should not be seen nor heard during waka and class time, without teacher permission for use in an educational activity. Students not following this rule will have their device confiscated.
- Devices will be returned at lunch time, the following the day.
- If this is a regular occurrence a longer confiscation time will apply.

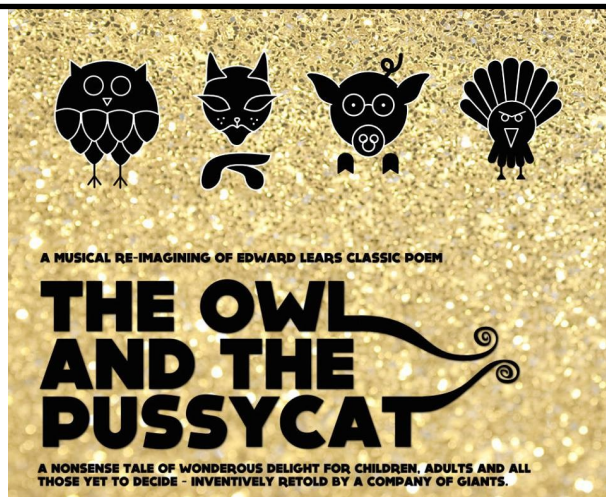

Sport Northland Basketball Officials course

On Tuesday 26th June, Mr McDonald and four students (Haydn Cole, Ty-Izaiah Brownlee, Kepara Renau and Tyler Moore) took part in the Sport Northland Basketball Officials course. This was a 2-hour course that involved learning the basic rules and procedures required to referee secondary school level basketball games.

Some of the key points covered were:

- The positioning of refs on the court and how to work together
- Communication with the bench staff and the coaches of each team
- Types of violations to call during games, including hand signals and procedures to follow when making a call
- Types of fouls to call during games, including hand signals and procedures to follow when making a call
- Pathways students can go through as a referee if they choose to pursue being a professional
- How referees are not perfect and need to be respected

Overall this was a very positive experience for both the teacher and students, as there was a lot of good learning going on and confidence building.

I am looking forward to seeing the students progress further with their basketball IQ and confidence on court.

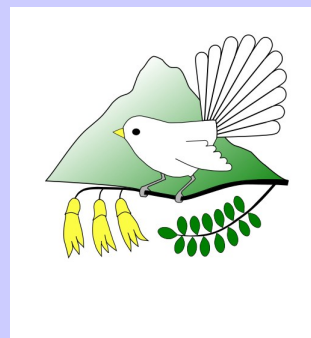
We still need a few more families to host our visiting Japanese students early next term.
